A NOTE FROM JOHN HOOMES

I'd like to welcome everyone to another great season of opera. We have an assortment of amazing productions in store, and we invite you to take a magical excursion with us. This journey will take you from the mystic world of Mozart's most fantastical opera to the passion and betrayal lurking behind the scenes of a small traveling carnival, then on to a deep dive into the mysterious currents of the Amazon river, and finally, a voyage into the intricate inner workings of the human mind itself.

Our season begins with one of the most passionate and intense Italian operas ever written, Leoncavallo's PAGLIACCI (The Clowns). Based on a true story, Leoncavallo's opera (written in 1892) paints a vivid portrait of unbridled passion, betrayal, and revenge; illustrating, that in a 130-year-old opera, for better or worse, human nature rarely seems to change. Filled with beautiful arias, full-throated singing, and a powerhouse, gripping story, PAGLIACCI is the perfect opera for the seasoned opera goer, as well as the first-time attendee.

For our second production, we feature an opera by composer Michael Nyman (most famous for writing the score for the Oscar winning 1993 erotic period drama film, THE PIANO). This touching work is based on the case studies of neurologist Oliver Sacks and is titled THE MAN WHO MISTOOK HIS WIFE FOR A HAT (taken from the title of Sacks' famous 1985 book). Exploring the connection between the brain, existence, and the soul, the opera is a sometimes comedic, yet often poignant story, brilliantly capturing the wonder and mystery of the workings of the human brain and offering us the opportunity to experience the humanity behind the science.

In January, to add some heat to the cold weather, Nashville Opera presents Daniel Catán's lush, romantic opera FLORENCIA EN EL AMAZONAS. Inspired by the writings of Gabriel Garcia Marquez, this ravishingly beautiful, dreamlike opera is an examination of love in all of its joys and follies. Join us as we take a voyage into the sensual world of "magical realism", overflowing with a vibrant orchestral score inspired by the lush romanticism of Puccini and Ravel. This is the same work Nashville Opera took to NYC's Lincoln Center in 2016, and will be an experience not to be missed.

Finally, we will close our mainstage season with one of the most popular operas even written, Mozart's THE MAGIC FLUTE. The genius of Mozart shines bright in this masterfully diverse mix of unforgettable melodies, majestic choruses, laugh out loud comedy, and the stratospheric, show-stopping coloratura singing of The Queen of the Night. This opera is one of the most imaginative entertainments ever created, blending myth, magic, and the battle between good and evil. This opera offers a magical, colorful, enchanting experience for the entire family.

And there we are. Another great season of opera, containing something for everyone. I so appreciate you joining us for these dynamic musical adventures, and I want to say a special thank you for your support of the arts in Nashville. I look forward to seeing you at the opera.





Exploring the connection between the brain, existence, and the soul, Michael Nyman's opera is a sometimes comedic, yet often poignant story of a family coping with adversity through the healing power of music. Composer Michael Nyman (who wrote the soundtrack to the movie THE PIANO) uses clever rhythmic repetition and varied orchestral color to push the story forward and build dramatic tension, even when the scene in question is nothing more than a routine visit to a doctor's office. But the music tells us there is indeed something unseen living just below the surface.

With this chamber opera, Nyman captures the wonder and mystery of the workings of the human brain, and offers us the opportunity to experience the humanity behind the science.


